Many owners have, or soon will receive notices if their fence needs to be stained because it is visibly worn, faded and not a uniform color.

Here are a couple of helpful hints to keep in mind:


Power wash the fence and clean with bleach **prior** to staining. Staining over the existing stain will result in a color that is discolored and unapproved.

Use approved semi-transparent stain. Sherwin Williams Cedar Bark #3511, Lowes Olympic Sierra.

Does your neighbor also need to restained? If so, share in the cost of renting the power washer to save time and money!

Here are some examples of fences needing to be stained:





Water stained, faded and a black/grey hue are indications of a fence needing to be stained.



This is a picture of a home with the correct stain that has a consistent, uniform color.

All fences, when installed had the approved color stain. However, over the years, the stain will need to be reapplied. Doing so helps to seal the fence and protect against splintering, avoids mildew, enhances the wood grain without hiding the natural beauty of the wood and increases the lifespan of your wooden fence.





Keep Our Common Areas Clean

Heartland has many common areas and vacant lots that back up to existing homes. These common areas and vacant lots are mowed by a very large piece of equipment because some of the areas needing to be mowed are vast and large. Recently, we have noticed concrete, wood fencing materials, stone, wooden posts, grass clippings, etc. laying in the common areas behind homes and vacant lots which is unsightly and can cause extensive damage to the mowing equipment. It is prohibited to dump debris in the common areas behind home..

Please do not put any debris behind your home or in vacant lots. If noted, you will be required to remove the debris and could be fined. Please help in keeping our common areas free from debris and looking attractive.

IT'S TIME TO PRUNE YOUR TREES, IF:

... your tree's limbs are blocking ready access to the sidewalk. If someone can't walk down the sidewalk without ducking under limbs or having to walk around the limbs, then pruning is necessary.

Your mail delivery person can't drive safely up to your mailbox without the tree limbs scratching their vehicle. The USPS requires that their vehicles be able to drive up to the mailbox without any obstructions, and that includes tree limbs. If your limbs are too low or stick out into the street too far, then pruning is necessary.

REMEMBER to prune out any dead limbs and shape your tree. Never 'top' a tree. This causes all sorts of problems, including wounds that heal poorly, severe dieback and destroys the tree's natural symmetry.

Keep Kids and Sitter Safe

IMAGINE THIS: IT'S VALENTINE'S DAY, AND YOU'RE PLANNING A NIGHT OUT. YOU'VE reserved a table and booked a babysitter. You've gone over everything:

instructions for the kids' routines, important contact information and where to find supplies.

But did you also prepare your home? With a little preparation, you can help ensure your children's safety, make your babysitter's life easier and secure a peaceful night out for yourself.

First, your home's electrical system should be in good working order.

Looking for and repairing electrical problems well before your evening out is an important step in preventing electrical accidents.

Cracked outlet covers and discolored outlets and switches are indications of electrical problems. These problems can lead to fires and electric shocks. Contact a professional to have your home inspected and any problems repaired.

These additional tips can help increase safety awareness, eliminate electrical hazards and put your mind at ease:

ELECTRICAL SAFETY

- Repair or dispose of damaged electronics and cords.
- Keep cords out of sight so that children are not tempted to play with them.
- ◆ Use outlet covers or tamper-resistant receptacles. Tamper-resistant outlets have a shutter system to keep them safe.
- Use ground-fault circuit interrupters to prevent shocks. You should have GFCI anywhere that water and electricity may meet, such as in bathrooms and kitchens.
- ◆ Have ready a fire extinguisher that is rated for electrical fires. Be sure your babysitter knows where it is and how to use it.
- Install smoke alarms, and be sure their batteries work.
- Post a list of emergency phone numbers that includes contact info for your electric cooperative.

With preparation, you can make sure that your children are in the safe comfort of home while you enjoy your night out.


