Why do I have to pay HOA assessments? Homeowners who reside in a community with a Homeowners Association are required to pay association fees as stated in the governing documents of their Please contact the association office if you would Association. Heartland HOA assessments are due like to discuss your account. semi annually (February 1st and August 1st). HOA 9am-5pm, 972-564-1511. assessments help fund the day to day operation and maintenance of the common property; assessments provide services for the benefit of all homeowners.

What do HOA assessments cover? The assessment paid to the Association is applied toward the operating expenses of the common area and provides reserve funds for the replacement cost of particular items in future years. HOA assessments generally pay for the association insurance policies, amenity services and upkeep, association management, enforcement of the rules, property and in

come taxes, and reserve funding for future repairs and maintenance. In addition, HOA assessments preserve and maintain common area elements such as landscaping services, sprinklers, utilities, lighting, signage, and watering of association owned common areas. The neighborhood communication tools such as the website, newsletter, and community social events are also part of the HOA budget.

What happens if I do not pay my HOA assessment? Maintenance and management services for the community are incurred by the Association. HOA's are dependent upon timely receipt of the assessments due from each homeowner. In addition, the Association faces funding challenges in performing necessary community maintenance functions when HOA assessment payments are delinquent.

Payment of the February assessment is due and payable February 1st. Failure to pay your assessment will result in a \$30 penalty charged to 4. Set up 'Bill Payment' through your banking insti- your account on March 2nd and penalties will continue to be charged monthly until the account is paid in full. You will not have access to the pool or association events if your account is not current.

Ladder Safety Tips

Check your local weather report. Standing on a ladder in high winds could cause you to lose your balance. In addition, light drizzle can cause your ladder to become slippery. Make sure you pick a dry day with calm winds.

Properly inspect your ladder. Before using your ladder, make sure it's in good working order. If you store your ladder in a shed or outside, make sure you double-check it.

Select the appropriate ladder size for the job. Standing on the top is very dangerous and can cause the ladder to become very unstable. One wrong move and you could be in a world of hurt. If you plan on going on your roof, make sure the ladder extends three feet above the roof elevation.

Don't stretch. While stretching is good for you before using the ladder, stretching or reaching while on a ladder can lead to injury. Over-stretching on a ladder could cause it to kick out from under you.

Be cautious by doors. If you're working by a door that can open toward the ladder, let your family know



AKC Recommended Dog Care in Cold Weather

There's a lot to prepare for when it comes to winter weather. Just like we're affected by the cold, our dogs are, too. Here are a few simple measures you can take to make sure your dog stays happy and healthy throughout the winter.

• Use warm water to clean your dogs paws and make sure to reach spots between the toes and pads. Some dogs will also need a moisturizer for dry skin.

• Dogs can suffer from frostbite, especially on delicate earflaps and tail tips. In extreme cold, it's a good idea to keep dogs inside, with the exception of the heavy-coated northern breeds that thrive in low temperatures. If it's not possible to keep the dogs indoors, be aware of the major signs of frostbite, which include skin that appears white or blue.

• Even a big fuzzy dog that lives indoors will need some time to acclimate to freezing temperatures. Short romps outside will help your dog's body get used to the change in the weather.


• Make sure small, delicate, and short-haired dogs, even large ones like Greyhounds, have an appropriate winter wardrobe. Bonus: You can have fun dressing them up.

• Where climate is concerned, age is more than a number. Like humans, very young and very old dogs have a hard time regulating body temperature, so they have more extreme reactions to changes in weather. Keep the oldsters and the puppies indoors as much as possible.


